Introduction

Save Our Sausalito is pleased to present the results of the first ever Save Our Sausalito Election Issues Survey. A total of 364 Sausalito voters participated, both through paper and online surveys, giving a strong indication of concerns and aspirations of Sausalito residents.

All five city council candidates also filled out the survey and their responses are reported here as a Voter Guide.

To ensure a broad representation of opinions, our outreach efforts included digital media, engagement at farmers markets, and grassroots outreach through word of mouth. This enabled us to collect diverse opinions from the Sausalito community regarding key issues affecting our community.

The survey data revealed a clear consensus among respondents on several key priorities:

- 93% support preserving the Historic District
- 93% support maintaining scenic views
- 89.5% support affordable housing in Sausalito.

These findings reflect a strong desire within the community to protect the unique character of Sausalito while addressing pressing housing needs. “Considering housing in the Marinship” had a greater diversity of opinion, but still was opposed by 56% of respondents.

Among infrastructure investments “sidewalks” and “sea level rise mitigation” were clear priorities.

In contrast, it is troubling and noteworthy that only 16.7% of participants felt that the city council’s decision-making process was transparent.

We invite you to review the council candidates’ fuller statements and the several hundred comments from citizens in the Issue List and Voice of the People sections.

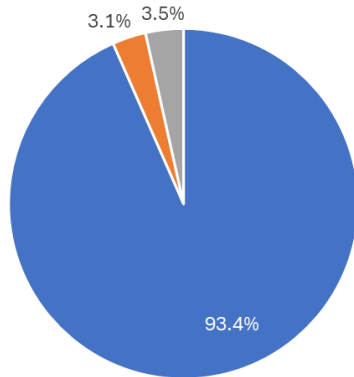
Save Our Sausalito hopes these detailed responses and insights will provide a deeper understating of the community’s views and priorities as we move forward together.

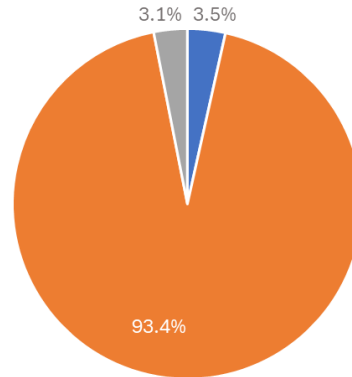

Do you support the preservation of the historic district?



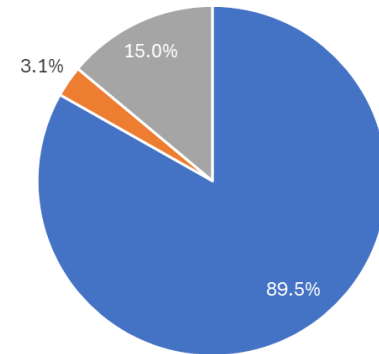

Should new housing be able to block residents views?



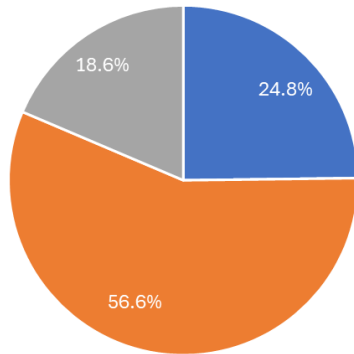

Do you support affordable housing in Sausalito?



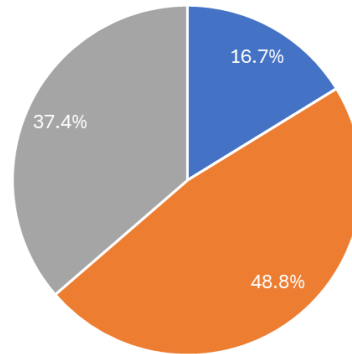

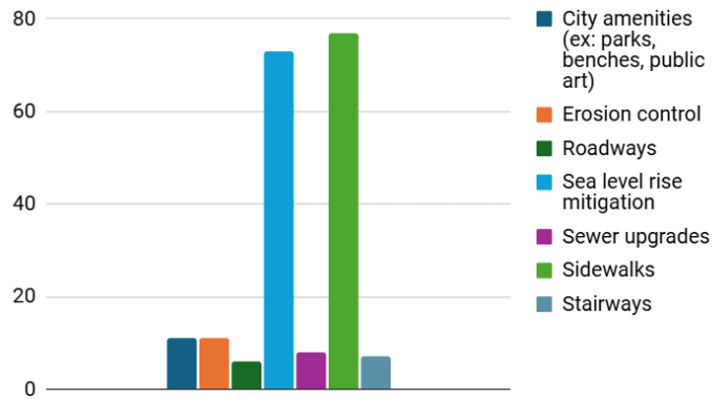
Do you consider City Council decision making to be transparent?



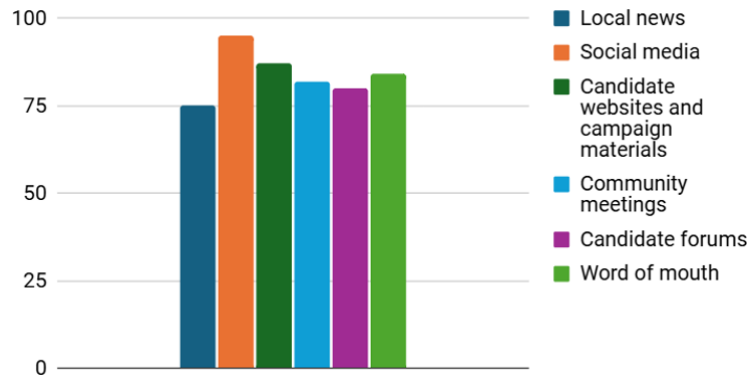
